Strathroy Singers Win Novice Contest

On Saturday, February 23rd the St. Thomas Elginaires hosted the Western Division Novice Contest at Grace United Church in St. Thomas. All members of the Barbershop Harmony Society, chapters from Seaforth, St. Thomas, London and Strathroy attended this afternoon of fun and competition. Judging and adjudication duties were performed by "Nito" a quartet from the Toronto Chapter.


The London "Men of Accord" won first place in the chorus category and in the VLQ (Very Large Quartet) contest London's entrees "Half Accord" and "Forward Motion" won 1st and 2nd place. And from Strathroy, with the combined voices of Bob Fennell, Jim McDougall, Frank Knoll, Don Bazely, Adrian Smith, John Gough, Henry Wiersema, Gil Craenen and Bob Howlett, "Second Avenue" took 3rd place.

First place in the Seniors Quartet finals went to the Strathroy quartet "Over the Hill Gang" with Bob Fennell (T), Don Bazely (Bs), Ron Smith (L) and Gord Stacey (Ba). To qualify as a senior quartet the combined age of all four members must be more than 250 years with the minimum age of fifty-five years old.

The regular Novice Quartet Contest 1st place was won by the Strathroy quartet "Generation Gap" comprised of Adrian Smith (T), Bill Robertson (L), Don Bazely (Bs) and John Gough (Ba). London's "Four in Accord" took 2nd and in 3rd place Strathroy's "Adrian's Quartet" with Adrian Smith (T), Bob Howlett (L), Frank Knoll (Bs) and Roswell McPherson (Ba).

Since Strathroy's Chapter placed 1st in the chorus contest last year it was not allowed to compete this year, but with the VLQ 3rd place, seniors 1st place and a 1st and 3rd place in the regular quartet contest the members of the "Vocal Federation" had a great day!!!!
