
First

The First Annual Strathroy Chapter Novice Competitions took place on Wednesday, January 22nd. Many guests including the Contest Judges, the quartet HIGH TIME from London, and Contest Master of Ceremonies Rick Madzia, also from London, joined us in a vocal warm up. After President Jim McDougall welcomed all in attendance, we broke up into our three chapter VLQs (Very Large Quartets) and had an opportunity to practice before each VLQ performed one song which they are preparing to sing in Mitchell at the Western Division Novice Competitions on the 22nd of February. We were joined by Harold's Angels at the close of their meeting as we took a break for refreshments prior to the Novice Quartet Contest. Despite a lengthy disabled list due to injuries and illness, nine quartets competed in the competition which is designed to give new or inexperienced barbershoppers the

opportunity to experience the thrill of barbershop quartet singing. Ten new quartet men had their first performance experience and each performed very well. The first quartet experience for anyone is very exciting, although that is seldom the word used by the rookie in his description. Butterflies and a dry mouth, shaking knees and hands and even the odd wavering voice are often the case in novice competitions but not so with our competition as every man did himself proud.

The quartet "Shoulder Deep" featuring Vetrinarian tones of Ted Gough and Frank Knoll, supplemented by John Gough and Brian McDougall placed third with Ted performing in his first quartet competition. Second place went to "Rural Routines", who were a late entry formed from a late scratch with Ernie McEwen, Bob Howlett, Roswell McPherson and Les Campbell doing a masterful job filling Craig Bycraft's shoes (Craig - watch your back!). The top spot was left to the lowest form of man who were

ever bold enough to cross the stage. Four men simply named Huh, Uhg, Duh and Ahg caused such mortal fear in the hearts of the judges that a congressional committee on the ethics of grunting will be reviewing tapes of the competition to determine if the competition should be retried with a new jury. If nothing else, "B.C." proved one thing - even blonde cavemen have more fun! The real winner in the novice competition is the Vocal Federation. Each of the men that participated in this competition or even the preliminary competition in December is a better performer because of it and the entire chapter along with each individual member will benefit from competing. 
Boy, We Get Around!



\$100,000.00 was presented to our charity in just over an hour.

A video presentation put together from some of the greatest all time barbershop presentations as well as a presentation by all of the faculty members commenced our core classes. No matter how often you attend the same class there is always something new to be learned to better your chapter and yourself as a Barbershopper.

After a couple of class sessions and a chapter planning session we had the chance to see and listen to some of the best quartets in the District. Gold Rush, Tribute, Kingpins and Jukebox all sang and entertained very well. After the show concluded, we went back to our rooms and after discussing the events of the day, we sang until we thought we had an International calibre VLQ or at least that's what it sounded like to us.



News from HEADQUARTERS

(From SPEBSQSA Update - January 1997)

As of December 31, 1996, the Society has 34,225 Members in 808 chapters and 19 licensed sites. That's up 877 members for the end of 1995, a solid 2.6% growth. Fifteen of the sixteen districts grew with Rocky Mountain showing the greatest gain of 8 percent. Pioneer District was second in gain, growing by 5 percent and Central States, Dixie, Seneca Land, Southwestern and our own Ontario District each increased membership by 4 percent. The two membership campaigns of last year, Operation Harold Hill and Let's Make A Deal had a great deal to do with the growth. A new campaign is already on the horizon. Get ready to play Barbershop Bingo.

Our toll free phone line at the Society head office in Kenosha continued to be busy in 1996 with over 80,000 calls received. Remember 1-800-876-SING for all your Barbershop questions and queries.

The U.S. portion of the Sing America/Sing Canada service project will have a chance to jump onto the national stage in a March 13th event in Washington D.C. The event is to coincide with the 13th annual "World's Largest Concert" which is planned to be broadcast on PBS via satellite hook-up and 1:00 pm.

Our first meeting of the new year was held on January 22, 1997. We met at the Presbyterian Church in the Parlour. We discussed the new telephone system that

was set in place to help improve communications amongst the auxiliary. It was used to reschedule this meeting and seemed to work quite well.

Our fundraising adventures and realized profits from 1996 were discussed and notes made for improvements were recorded. All in all, Harold's Angels had a very successful first year and we were more than happy to forward a "pot of gold" on to our fellows, the Vocal Federation, at the Christmas party. Through our efforts, the Strathroy Chapter was able to forward funds to Harmonize for Speech, including a donation made on behalf of Harold's Angels. Our auxiliary's name will now be added to a special plaque in Harmony Hall in Toronto. Way to go girls!!

New business at the meeting included fund raising ideas for the year, we decided we would repeat some of this years activities including: the Strawberry Social (June 97), Yard Sale (May 10/97), and a Christmas Bake Sale (December 97). Some of the new ideas involved hosting a Country Home Party (October 97) and a Jewelry Party (Spring 97). We also discussed the possibly selling Cheese and Gift Packs.

Harold's Angels will again be responsible for the Afterglow following the Vocal Federation Chapter Show on May 3, 1997. We will also be working during the afternoon and evening performances selling tickets, etc.

After all of this planning, the entertainment for the evening was about to begin as the Vocal Federation held their first annual Novice Quartet Competition. It was a very enjoyable time and we were honoured to have High Time act as judges for the competition and perform as well. Little did we also know, we have a few
