

So I thought, "Why not go!" Jim told us about the Pep Rally being held for the chorus and two quartets who were representing our district at International in Anaheim, California.





Well, what a surprise! It was held in a great facility with wonderful acoustics. Yes - it was rah rah alright, but it was also four hours plus of the finest singing I have ever heard.

The fund raiser, as it really is, was non-stop entertainment and the best bang for \$10.00 one could want. For me it was the only time I had been able to listen, in a comparative way, to so many choruses and quartets. They were all different and yet the same, in that the fundamentals of proper singing that our directors have been hammering at us were truly present.

There were choruses and quartets from Oakville, Burlington, Guelph, Kitchener-Waterloo, St. Thomas, etc. Highlights were of course the Northern Lights chorus, where so few make a sound like so many. Quartets – Terminal Barbershop and By Design which both sounded like one sweet voice.

This event, sponsored by APOC (the Association of Past Ontario district quartet Champions), is a clinic in barbershop singing. It is an event that is financially very helpful for subsidizing the competitors (approximately \$11,000 to the chorus, \$2,800 to By Design and \$1,500 to Terminal Barbershop) partly from our dues but largely from the entry fee of \$10.00 plus bar and raffles.

But it really is more than a pep rally or a fund raiser. It is an absolutely golden opportunity to hear the best barbershopping there is to hear. Imagine, even the Four Chorders, who started out singing at London's Beck Collegiate in the 40's, performed with two of the original members. And the sweet sounds of the young voices and the matured sound of the "older" singers - what a great combination.

Next year consider going to this event. It is a four hour afterglow that is an absolute treat. My, we have a ways to go but what wonderful examples to strive to emulate.

Thanks Jim for asking us to be part of the evening. Let's get a few more of us there next year. It would be time well spent (and cheap with the rocket fuel Jim puts in that converted van).

## Dick Van Dyke (continued)

"I was very active in stage musicals and operettas in high school. The kids today get to do a lot of the hot new material, popular stuff, which we weren't doing in those days. I didn't care, really: I just wanted to sing. There were only two of us basses in a cappella choir, too, so we got plenty of chances."

"I had a quartet in high school, too. We never had any sheet music or anything, we just woodshedded and had a lot of fun."

Dick took the customary 15 years to become an overnight sensation, working in radio, nightclubs, and local television before landing a spot on The CBS Morning Show as co-anchor with Walter Cronkite, and soon appearances on all the major television variety shows. Broadway followed, and in 1960, Dick won the lead role in Bye, Bye Birdie, for which he garnered a Tony Award.

Sheldon Leonard and Carl Reiner spotted Dick in Birdie, and signed him to star in the series that became The Dick Van Dyke Show, which debuted on CBS in 1961. Dick won five Emmy Awards for the show. "You know, there was a lot of singing and dancing on that show something like 30 song or dance numbers!" says Dick. "Mary [Tyler Moore] and I used to have so much fun with those she's such a great talent."

Perhaps his most widely

recognized musical performances were in the films Mary Poppins (1964) and Chitty Chitty Bang Bang (1968). The lyrical witticisms and cheekiness of the Sherman Brothers' songs perfectly matched Dick's physical style and well-loved comic persona. In the seventies, these characteristics would bring him another Emmy for the critically ac-claimed (but short-lived) Van Dyke & Company musical variety show.

In 1979, Dick returned to the theater in a hit revival of The Music Man. "I'll never get tired of The Music Man. I did nearly a year of it, eight performances a week. Every night, when the quartet sang 'Lida Rose,' I'd be standing in the wings, singing along with the bass. 'Couldn't you get sick just one night?' I asked him, but it never worked out, even though I knew all the lines." Continued as **Dick Van Dyke** on Page 4

"Drop by and sing sometime."

Dick Van Dyke's career in recent years has been mostly dramatic roles, including the past six seasons of Diagnosis Murder, but music is still a big part of his life. "I'm a shower singer, and I drive around listening to my barbershop learn-ing tapes. People see me in the car and look at me like I'm nuts."

"I like to sing at home, too. I have one of those fancy karaoke machines, with just about every pop standard you can think of. I like to have people over, and stick a microphone in their hand and ask them to sing. "Oh no, I can't sing," they say, but I just tell them, "You know the song, just do it." Suddenly it's two o'clock in the morning and I can't get them out of there!

"Anybody who doesn't sing is missing a lot of the best part of life. I feel the same way about dancing. Tuning and movement are what life is all about. It's just good for your soul."
