At 2.10 p.m. on Tuesday, January 24, 1854 the first train passed through a village by the name of Glencoe.

The railroad helped Glencoe grow into the thriving agricultural based village and community it is today. The train still stops in Glencoe but some things have changed. The station which was built by the Grand Trunk and Wabash railways was closed in the late 1980's. In 1990 it was purchased by the Village for the sum of \$1.00.

With the help of the Rotary Club, the District Historical Society, the Station Restoration Committee and donated labour, the station was moved to a new location, a basement was dug and the building was completely renovated and restored.

On Monday, September 3, 2001 the Village had the official opening and dedication of the new building and our Vocal Federation was invited to take part in the ceremony. The Vocal Federation chorus was very well represented and did a fine job of entertaining by performing half a dozen musical numbers.

From all reports we were well received. We were pleased to be asked and proud to be a part of Glencoe's celebrations.


