Update personal information on Members Only -Please give this information the widest possible distribution

Members Only is a tremendously useful tool for all Barbershoppers to update personal information -especially an e-mail address -- as well as other information such as mailing address, phone number.

Why is it important? In a recent e-mail to chapter, district and Society officers, 125 or more were returned as undeliverable. As this particular mailing is a weekly item, there's a lot of information going unread by key Society leaders.

Using Members Only is very simple. Start by logging on to the Society web site (www.spebsqsa.org) then click on "Members Only" at the top of the page. If you are a current user, sign in and scroll down to "Update your member information."

If you are a first-time user, you'll need to get password from the headquarters. On the sign-in page, scroll down to "Step 2: Don't have a password? Click HERE" and follow the instructions. A password will be e-mailed to you. When you receive it (normally within 24 hours), log on to Members Only, enter your password and click on the box that says "Check here to remember this login." That way, each time you sign in your password will be remembered and you will not have to re-enter it.

Then scroll down to "Update your member information."
