

I stood at the door immediately following the show. Also, the 2 quartets, the "School Board" & the "4 Reasons Why" greeted folk as they exited from the school. I really thought that was a good idea. The audience passed on a lot of positive comments. I know that the Strathroy guys circulated after the shows & that is good - I do think it would be nice if 4 guys from the Strathroy Chapter also greeted people as they left - just a suggestion.

I received a lot of positive comments from folks as they left & some suggestions as well so I will pass them on to you.

1..Breaking up the singing with something different would be a good idea - eg. someone playing an instrument, a dance routine. Personally, I agree with this suggestion & I would suggest something different early in the second half.

2.. The show was a bit long - each quartet should sing a maximum of 2 numbers. The guest quartet should sing a maximum of 4 songs in each package. I tend to agree with this suggestion as well.

3.. There should be more comedy songs in the show - Murphy was great. You need more of the fun stuff. I, too, think that fun is good, especially for the kids. In fact this was not a suggestion but I think it would be good to have a couple of kid fun songs for the kids - there were a lot of kids there.

Those 3 suggestions are the only ones that I received - the comments were, in general, very positive.

Just thought I would pass these on for your consideration.


